

PC Curtis Richie visit

On the 13th of December, a policeman visited Maple class at Wooler First School, he was called PC Curtis. about responsibility, discipline talked consequences, there are two types of discipline and consequence they are positive and negative. PC Curtis talked to us about discipline, not punishment, but selfcontrol. He said this was making sure you are good, doing your jobs and thinking about what you are doing before you do it. Bad discipline would be if you were supposed to be doing the dishes, and you watched TV instead or if you didn't get up when you're meant to, and you are late. Adults need to be disciplined too; it would be bad if an adult shot someone, also if they didn't go to work when they should be there. Then he talked about consequences of our actions, like what would happen if we didn't do our responsibilities when we should. Some people said consequences were things like no pocket money, iPhone taken away and NO sweets. Consequences for adults were worse. They could lose their job, their house and maybe even go to prison. We learnt that more people need to take responsibility for their actions, and if they are good then they will get rewards and if they are bad they will get punished. It was fun because we found out lots of interesting things and if we do all the good things we will be nicer and more responsible for our actions.
