


Wooler First School -Spring Newsletter 2025

Here are the winners of the Easter egg competition. Judging was very difficult as they were all brilliant. Well done to everyone who entered














We are Autism Family Support Workers that are a part of the Autism Support Team within HINT at Northumberland County Council.

Ne run our Autism Family Drop in sessions across all of Northumberland. Each session is free, two owns long and is a chance to come along to meet us and other parents for an informal chat over a cuppe. There is no set agenda for the drop ins. It is a chance to seek support and advice from us and other parents, however there is no expectation to talk about your child if your don't want to. Any parent/carer or family members are welcome to attend any session, you do not need to attend the session in the area that you live in. The sessions are not for professionals.



Do I need to book?

No, just turn up on the day.

Do I need to stay for the two hours?

No, you can drop in at any time that is convenient for you.

Can I bring my child with me?
