

How to Look After our Rabbits

Quite a few of the classes in school had a visit from the Cheviot Vets recently. Katie and Lizzie came into school to explain to the children how to look after our new rabbits, Hutch and Ralphie (Nursery also have one called Florence). While in school, the vets gave the rabbits a health check and the injections they needed. The children were able to ask lots of questions.







Learning to Read

<u>Phonics</u> is taught daily in Little Acorns, Oak, Cherry and Cedar Class. We use a scheme called Read Write Inc. In Little Acorns Nursery children start learning phonics when staff and key workers feel that they are ready. At the end of your child's time in Cherry Class (Year 1) children are required to take a National Phonics screening test. Any child who does not pass is required to re-sit the test at the end of Year 2.

In Willow and Maple Class there is a greater emphasis on spelling strategies, punctuation and grammar.

<u>In Oak Class</u> we will be learning phonic sounds and starting the exciting journey that is reading. Please practice your sounds every night. Little and often is usually best.

<u>In Cherry Class</u> the emphasis remains on building phonic skills and learning to blend and segment words. <u>From Cedar Class 2</u> onwards your child will read either individually with an adult or as part of a group for a guided reading session. Your help is essential if your child is to become a fluent reader. Please support your child by ensuring that they read at home every day.

This is also a good time for a reminder that children should be reading far wider than just their school reading book. A good reader needs to regularly read a range of fiction and non-fiction. This can include anything from comics, magazines, newspapers, information books to story and poetry books. The reading scheme book is the bare minimum requirement.

Regular visits to Wooler library are an excellent (and cheap!) way to support your child's development as a reader

Reading widely (and being read to) will help your children to develop an imagination which is essential if they are to become good writers. If you would like any advice on how you can support your child with reading and writing please speak to the class teacher.

<u>Handwriting:</u> This is taught during a short formal session each day. Children should be encouraged to use their best handwriting at home when doing their homework.

Northern Gas Networks Visit

Children recently had a visit from Alex from Northern Gas Networks. She talked about how they are going to be re-laying pipes in the streets around the school in the coming months. She explained to the children how to stay safe during the disruption!





Equipment Your Child Needs on Which Days

Being ready for learning is essential for success in school. Please make sure your child comes to school with the correct equipment / kit to enable them to participate in all National Curriculum subjects. This information does not apply to Nursery children.

This is a reminder of the items your child should bring to school each week.

Please make sure that the children come to school each day with the correct gear.

Thursday - £2 and football kit if doing lunchtime football. Please ensure your child brings a bootbag/carrier bag to put muddy boots in.

Swimming - On a swimming day your child will need swimming costume / trunks, bathing hat and towel. These should be clearly named and put in a bag which is also easily identified. Everyone <u>must</u> wear a swimming hat to ensure that the children do not spend the rest of the day with wet hair. (available from school for £1.50). Please send your child in **normal school uniform** (avoiding the wearing of tights) **and school shoes** on swimming days. Please ensure your child always comes to school with a coat and a hat.

Children will need their P.E. Kit and trainers **every week**.

All clothing must be clearly named.		

Long hair must be tied back for all lessons.

We would like to remind you of school policy concerning the wearing of jewellery during the school day. It is not permitted for children to wear any jewellery (or beauty accessories such as false nails, nail varnish, or henna tattoos) other than small watches. If your child has pierced ears **please remove earrings before they come to school.** Failure to do so means they cannot participate in swimming and P.E as it contravenes health and safety rules. If you plan to allow your child to have their ears pierced this must be done at the start of the school summer holidays to allow them to be fully healed before the start of the new academic year in September.

Outside learning

We spend at least one session per week learning in the outdoor environment. This takes place in all weathers so it would be helpful if all children could keep a set of warm but old clothes and wellies in school. Children in Willow and Maple Class would also benefit from bringing waterproof clothing if they have any.

Clothes

At the end of the summer term the lost property box was over flowing. Please ensure that <u>all</u> items of your child's clothing are clearly named. Unclaimed items will be disposed of termly either via a second hand sale or by being donated to charity.

Outgrown Clothes Donations

We are always grateful for the donation of outgrown wellies and lightweight waterproof jackets / trousers and walking boots. If you have any such items please send them into school with your child/children – thank you.

Fruits

The national fruit and vegetable government scheme is open to children in Years Reception, 1 and 2. However, we are very happy for children in Year 3 and 4 to bring a **healthy snack of fruit/vegetable** of their own to eat at playtime.

Open Door Policy

If you have any concerns regarding your child and school please come and talk to us. We operate an open door policy and are always willing to listen. However, do remember that if you need to speak to a teacher please make sure you do so at an appropriate time. As you will appreciate teaching staff are not available to talk to parents when class is just about to start or has started. If this is the case please ask the office staff to let the teacher know you need to speak to them and a convenient time will be arranged. Thank you for your co-operation.

If you do not need or wish to speak directly to a member of staff, there are the following other ways to raise any issues or ideas:

Skipping Festival


Maple Class had a fun morning preparing for a skipping festival in Berwick which they will take part in December. They have been enthusiastically practicing in the playground ever since!


