

Head Lice

We have identified a couple of cases of headlice here in school. As this is a condition which spreads easily and rapidly we are reminding all families of the importance of checking their child's hair regularly. Checking for headlice is a simple procedure using a special comb that can be obtained from supermarkets or the chemist. All family members will need to be checked too.

Advice from health professionals is to only treat where flive lice are seen. Further advice on treatment and prevention can be obtained at the chemist or online using the following NHS link: https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/head-lice-and-nits

If a child is found to have head lice in school parents will be informed immediately by telephone. A joint decision between home and school will then be made regarding the best course of action to deal with the problem. Suitable treatment should take place as soon as possible – once treated children are able to come straight back to school.

Berwick Swan Centre Multi-Skills Festival

On 8th March 13 children from Maple class travelled to the Swan Centre in Berwick for an inter-schools multi-skill festival. We met lots of other Year 4 children from across the area and really enjoyed all of the sports and events that we took part in. It was lots of fun and gave us some ideas for games to play back here at school.



Forest School Classroom

Wooler First School PTA are currently raising funds to create a Forest School Classroom. The outside classroom will be available to all 282 children aged 2-13 years that attend, Nursery, WFS & GMS and will be incorporated into our existing Forest School to enhance the pupils' outdoor learning experience and to promote mental and physical health as it has been proved that connecting children with the outdoors is good for their social and emotional development, improves mental health and psychological and emotional wellbeing.

The benefits of an outside classrooms in Forest School are many and include :

- The opportunity for hands on learning, such as science or nature lessons. Some pupils thrive in a more relaxed and experimental environment.
- Socialising and friendship between the pupils, as the outside classroom will provide a calmer zone for pupils who prefer to escape the busier more formal school surroundings.
- Improve concentration in pupils due to the fresh air environment and alternate learning platform by moving away from traditional text books.
- Decreased stress levels and increased social cohesion between pupils.
- Multi-sensory experiences allowing pupils to engage in the sense of touch, smell, hearing, taste and sight.
 Great British weather is not always kind during Forest School sessions. The provision of this added benefit to our Forest School would enable the children to still do outdoor activities within a shelter.

The PTA and teachers are exceptionally enthusiastic about working together to ensure the outdoor classroom project is completed as soon as possible so the pupils can start to benefit from such a superb educational addition to the school.

Artsmark Project—Working with Glendale Middle School

Wooler First and Glendale Middle Schools have been working alongside Woodhorn Museum as part of their ARTSMARK project. Artists Amy Lord and Judith Davies spent a few days at the schools, helping to devise and create some fantastic live artwork within the forest. This joint project encouraged cohesion, but also challenged the children's perception of what 'art' actually is. Letters were written, porcelain was moulded and experiences shared. Children will celebrate their achievements with other Northumberland schools at a day long event on the 25th June.


