



EARLY YEARS WOOLER FIRST SCHOOL

LONG TERM PLANNING FOR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION & PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT(please read alongside JM's planning Sheet)

Children in the both Oak Class and Little Acorns at Wooler First School follow Northumberland's Agreed Syllabus for Religious Education. For Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED), both classes adapt and plan where appropriate and focus learning at an age appropriate level throughout the year. In Oak Class PSED skills are also 'taught' in planned weekly sessions. All of this work incorporates 'British Values' (see separate document).

Through Religious Education children begin to explore the world of religion by focussing on special times and special people drawn initially from their own cultural and religious experiences and beliefs. Comparisons can then be drawn between those religions and cultures that are new and different to their own. They listen to and talk about stories and, through investigating books and objects and by visiting places of worship, children are introduced to religious words and concepts and use their senses in exploring religions and beliefs, practices and forms of expression.

They reflect on their own feelings and experiences. They use their imagination and curiosity to develop their appreciation and wonder of the world in which they live.

Although Religious Education is not a statutory requirement in Nursery it provides valuable educational experiences and does make a significant contribution towards meeting the requirements of the EYFS framework.
